VIOLATION TICKET ORDINANCE

In an effort to protect our community from blighted properties and to encourage compliance with the Borough of Leetsdale's ordinances regarding the maintenance and upkeep of the properties in town, council has enacted an ordinance which provides for a ticket to be issued when a nuisance violation occurs.

These violations include; but are not limited to, high grass and weeds, snow/ice on sidewalk, (over 24 hours) inoperable and/or unregistered vehicles, outside storage of household items, improper garbage/waste containers, placing garbage/trash out too early, accumulation of rubbish, garbage, or debris, unsanitary swimming pools, or

overgrown shrubs and/or hedges, that extend beyond the sidewalk or right of way.

Instead of a protracted process that drags offending property owners through the court system, the Borough of Leetsdale will now issue a "violation ticket" to the occupant of the property involved if the violation is not abated within the time period set forth. **The fine for these violations is set at \$50.00**, and for each day the violation exists, another ticket will be issued.

The goal of this ticket ordinance is not to fine the residents, but to ensure that their properties are kept in a sanitary condition with grass cut, snow and ice cleared from sidewalks, and all properties kept looking good for all to see. **Leetsdale is a beautiful town, let's keep it that way!**

MUNICIPAL SEPARATE STORMWATER SEWER SYSTEM

Pennsylvania's MS4 Program and what it means to you.....

The PA Department of Environmental Protection administers the Stormwater requirements of the federal Clean Water Act and, since 2002, has issued a General Permit for all municipal storm sewer systems, which requires the implementation of a *Stormwater Management Program* for minimizing the impacts from runoff. As individual municipalities are responsible for zoning, subdivision and land development ordinances that impact runoff, those communities that own a separate storm sewer system are responsible for issuing such permits and must meet the new regulations that were released in 2011.



When you're washing your car in the driveway, remember you're not just washing your car in the driveway.



All the soap, scum, and oily grit runs along the curb then into the storm drain directly into our lakes, streams and into our river. And, that causes pollution which is unhealthy for fish. So, how do you avoid this whole mess? Wash your car on grass or gravel instead of the street. Or better yet, take it to a car wash where the water gets treated and recycled.

When your car's leaking oil on the street, remember it's not just leaking oil on the street.




Leaking oil goes from car to street and is washed from the street into the storm drain and into our lakes, stream and into our river. Now image the number of cars in the area and you can imagine the amount of oil that finds its way from leaky gaskets into our water. So please, fix oil leaks.

When your pet goes on the lawn, remember it doesn't just go on the lawn.



When our pets leave those little surprises, rain washes all that pet waste and bacteria into our storm drains and then pollutes our waterways. So what to do? Dispose of it properly (preferably in the toilet). Then that little surprise gets treated like it should.

When you're fertilizing the lawn, remember, you're not just fertilizing the lawn.



You fertilize the lawn then it rains. The rain washes the fertilizer along the curb, into the storm drain and directly into our lakes, streams and into our rivers. This causes algae to grow, which uses up oxygen that fish need to survive. So if you fertilize, please follow directions and use sparingly.

When does fall 2016 begin?

This year, the autumnal equinox falls on September 22, 2016 at 10:21 A.M. EDT. This equinox occurs when the Sun appears to cross the celestial equator from north to south.

(The celestial equator is the circle in the celestial sphere halfway between the celestial poles. It can be thought of as the plane of Earth's equator projected out onto the sphere.)

Another definition of fall is nights of below-freezing temperatures combined with days of temperatures below 70 degrees Fahrenheit.

The word equinox means "equal night"; night and day are about the same length of time.



LEAF COLLECTION:

As fall approaches, leaf collection will begin as needed. We will pick up only leaves. Please do not include any branches, grass cuttings, or any other debris in your leaf pile as these materials will clog our machine and can become very costly to repair. Simply, pile all of your leaves between the sidewalk and street for collection. Although there is no set-schedule, pickups will be done as our schedule allows.

LEAF MULCH:

Leaf mulch is still available, "free of charge." It is available for you to pickup at the Borough Garage from 3PM- 7PM on weekdays. Leaf mulch is a great way to winterize gardens and planted areas.

TRASH COLLECTION:

Trash collection goes on as scheduled. Tuesday is the designated regular garbage and Thursday remains recycle collection. Cans or containers may only be placed at the curb after 6:00 PM on the day prior to collection.

TRASH COLLECTION

THURSDAY: Recycling collection only.

RECYCLE:

We ask that you make an effort to recycle, not only is it a great way to help reduce waste, but it also improves our environment.

ELECTRONICS:

Electronics are no longer being accepted at our land fill. All TV'S must be disposed of in accordance with regulations.

As always, there is a lot going on at the firehouse.

The Leetsdale Fire Department has sold their old squad truck. A committee has been formed to pursue the purchase of a new one. Please stay tuned ...for further information.



Your Leetsdale Fire Department is also in the process of purchasing a second **Thermal Imaging Camera**. This instrument will allow firefighters to see through smoke. Each Engine will now be equipped with this life saving equipment.

The Leetsdale Fire Department would like to invite residents to our **Annual Labor Day Picnic in Henle Park**. This event was started by Mayor Pete Poninsky a few years ago. It has grown each year. Come out and join us.



In the fall we change our clocks. The fire department would like to remind you to change the batteries in your smoke detectors when you change your clocks. If you don't have smoke detectors, or they are old, see information below. In conjunction with the American Red Cross, the Leetsdale Fire Department has started a smoke detector program. This program provides **free smoke detectors to residents**. The fire department will install these detectors at no charge. If you do not have smoke detectors, or if yours are over 10 years old, please contact the Borough Office at **724-266-4820** to register. You will need to provide your name, your address, and phone number. We will then contact you for a convenient installation appointment.



Fire Prevention Week is observed, October 9th through the 15th, this year. As part of the Quaker Valley Fire Prevention Committee, we will be in the schools discussing stop, drop, and roll; Exit Drills in The Home (EDITH); an outside meeting place and other fire prevention and life safety themes. We encourage you to talk through these subjects at home.



Recently, the Leetsdale Fire Department has expanded their presence on the internet. We encourage the community to follow us on Facebook. We have also started a new web site. Stop by and visit us at www.leetsdalefire.org It is a work in progress, but it gives the residents a good idea of what is going on. A Message from our President

From My Porch...

Looking back at my last newsletter article, I wrote about construction on Broad and Washington Streets and its various inconvenience's and disruptions. I couldn't have stated the truth any better. It's been a long dusty summer, and it's not over yet.

The Columbia Gas project still lingers on for Broad Street residents, with some issues of poor sidewalk reconstruction and broken curbs. Washington Street has received a new storm water sewer, but still needs to be milled and paved. The Washington and Broad Street repaving are being funded through the "Road Reconstruction Tax" with the amount for Broad Street being reimbursed by Columbia Gas and Edgeworth Water. Any remaining balance will be paid by the borough. The borough has awarded both bids, but the paving contractor would like to do both streets together, so we are waiting for the water line project on Broad to finish up in the fall.

Recently, the question was brought up at council, was it cheaper to do the trash collection in house or have a contractor do the job? Leetsdale, has picked up and disposed of its own garbage for many years. As of this writing, a committee has been formed to compare costs. The borough has reached out, along with the other local communities, to the local COG, (Quaker Valley Council Of Governments) to advertise and get a bid on trash collection. This bid along with others, will be reviewed and compared to the costs of doing our own trash collection. **No decision has been made at this point to go to an outside vendor. Garbage pick-up and recycling is still currently being done by our public works crew.** The borough would certainly give residents a chance to voice their concerns, and give them proper notification, if such change was going to occur.

The Tuesday night, before our "regular council meeting" is our "workshop meeting." It is a very informal meeting and a great time for residents to discuss issues and/or ideas, with council. The following... "Thursday" meeting, is the formal borough business meeting with the audience addressing council, only at the beginning of the meeting.

I know a few times, there have been some heated debates and arguments at the meetings, but after the dust clears it's the good humor and friendship that show how we all are truly neighbors.

AUTUMN SAFETY TIPS FOR YOUR PETS

Summer is surely coming to an end—the kids are back to school and the days will slowly become shorter and cooler. The end of the sweltering heat isn't always a bad thing! Autumn is a great time for outdoor adventures with your pet.

Here are a few risks to be aware of in the upcoming season:

Back to school supplies. Items in your

kid's pencil box like glue sticks, pencils and magic markers are considered "low toxicity" to pets, which means they're unlikely to cause serious problems unless they digest large amounts! However, since blockages are possible, be sure to keep them out your paw's reach.

Mushrooms. Unfortunately, most of the highly toxic mushrooms are difficult to distinguish from the nontoxic ones, so it's best to keep them away from all mushrooms.

Engine Coolant. Many people choose fall as the time to change their car's

engine coolant. Ethylene glycol-based coolants are highly toxic, so spills should be cleaned up immediately.

Bonfires. Fall is a great time to snuggle up around a bonfire. However, fire can be a great danger for your curious pets. Make sure that you close up your fireplaces, block off any fire pits, and keep your pet away from a spark zone.





DANIEL LEET'S TAVERN

Daniel Leet's Tavern (Leetsdale), a handsome stone structure, was built about 1800. Major Leet was commissioned deputy surveyor for Augusta County, Virginia, April 17, 1776. After the Revolutionary War, Pennsylvania named him deputy surveyor to survey "donation and depreciation lands" in the western part of the state. Leet's district, the second depreciation district, included part of Beaver County lying north of the Ohio River.



Leetsdale is at the southern tip of it. The tavern, at the corner of Beaver and Winding Road, has been a private residence for many years.
